

The Population of Lincolnshire

- The Lincolnshire (County) population is 743,400 and is predicted to rise by 2023
- Population of 65s and over is 91,700 in Lincolnshire
- Population of Lincoln (City) is 97,800
- 14,085 students studying at the University of Lincoln across all subjects
- 75% are school leavers
- 25% are mature students



The history that made today possible



- Her Majesty the Queen opened the first University of Lincoln Building on the Brayford Campus in 1996
- It was a University forged by the will of a community, not by a government directive, and the first new city centre campus to be built in the UK for decades
- The Times Good University Guide described it as "the most dramatic transformation of a university in recent times."







The University has invested over £300,000,000 into the development of the campus




Funding

- The new system as of 2017 requires students to pay their own tuition fees and living costs


